

## School of Technology

The Council of the School of Technology consists of:

- Heads of the Departments in the School (Engineering, Chemical Engineering and Biotechnology, the Computer Laboratory, the Judge Business School, and the Cambridge Institute for Sustainability Leadership),
- one member appointed by each of the Faculty Boards of Engineering, Computer Science and Technology, and Business and Management; and one member appointed by the Chemical Engineering and Biotechnology Syndicate,
- any member of the General Board of the Faculties who holds a University office in any of the institutions comprising the School,
- persons co-opted by the Council of the School (currently Heads of Divisions in Engineering and any member of the Council who is a staff member of any of the institutions comprising the School) and
- two Student Representatives (one undergraduate and one postgraduate).

The Council of the School meets twice a term, on Friday afternoons. Issues discussed at the meetings include:

- setting of the strategic strategy and plan of the School,
- resource allocation and capital project approval,
- School governance,
- education committee matters,
- research committee matters, and
- fundraising priorities.

In addition to attendance at meetings of the Council of the School, each student representative is an ex-officio member of the School's relevant Education Committees respectively (Undergraduate Education Committee and Graduate School Committee). The former meets as required and the latter meets once a term. This provides an opportunity for student representatives to discuss matters of policy and practice relating to undergraduate and graduate matters respectively. It also allows students to comment on developments of an educational nature within the School and the wider University. Involvement at the sub-committee level enables our student representatives to have a genuine input to the business of the Council of the School.

Student representatives are encouraged to consult and engage the student representatives at the Faculty Board level, and the general student population at large as appropriate.
